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THIS INDENTURE, made and entered into, May 20th. 1892 by and between R . C. Hazelip, Executor of the last will and testament of William Hazelip, dec. party of the first part and G. F. Moore of Edmonson County, Kentucky of the second part.

WITNESSETH, that the party of the first has this day for and in consideration of the sum of Four Thousand Dollars, One Thousand of which is in hand paid and the remainder secured to be paid by the execution to the party of the first, as Executor aforesaid (by the said second party) five promissory notes, for the sum of Six Hundred Dollars each with interest from this date until paid at the rate of 6% six per cent per annum. Interest on each note payable annually on the 20th day of May, in each year until paid. Note 1 due May 1, 1893. No. 2 due May 20, 1894, No. 3 due May 20th, 1895; No. 4, due May 20, 1896; and No. 5 due May 20, 1897; a failure to pay the interest on any of the notes annually or to pay either notes No. 1 or 2 for two months after due the whole of said notes and interest may be declared due at the option of the holder or owner of said notes and the lands subjected, and all liens enforced for the collection of said balance due, the same as if all of the notes had become due by expiration of time to---freeing the holder from the requirements to wait the expiration of time on last note.

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Hath granted bargained, sold and do hereby as Executor aforesaid sell alien and convey to the party of the second the following mentioned two tracts or parcels of ground lying and being in the County of Edmonson and State of Ky. on the Brownsville and Rocky Hill road and on both sides of the Louisville and Nashville Turnpike road, the first tract being the Old John Kertly Homestead about 2 miles North of Rocky Hill Station, and bounded as follows, beginning at 2 post oaks a stone and black jack on the side of the knob; thence W 39½ or 37½ poles to a stone and post oak at Ben Johnsons' fence; thence S 1 pole to a stone; then S 75 W. 115 poles to a stone marked J. A. C.; then S 8 E 216 poles to a stone Cooks' corner; then N 77 E 82 poles to a black jack and stone on the side of a sink hole then S 61 E 37 poles to two hickories
