

The Hazelips in The 1800 thru 1978

The sixth generation started in 1800 with your ~~great~~ great great grandfather Peter Hazelp of Edmonson county in Kentucky some where around Mammoth Cave we are told that he was lumber man and a farmer and that he had nine brother understand they were 1 thru 9 along about 1858 or 1859 he got married in time your ~~great~~ great great grandfather John Henry Hazelp was born June 10 1861 he had one brother Wash Hazelp two sister - Mary and Maggie Hazelp - John Henry Hazelp lived at home with Peter Hazelp until he was 19 years old or until the year 1880 when he left home and worked his way to Princeton Indiana which was only about 150 miles from his home & understand that was biggest trip of his life that is were he found a job on the farm the farm of the Mr Faden there he worked and married Florence Kathleen McFaden she was 14 year old at the time of marriage they stayed there at the farm and there first son was born after that son they moved back to Edmonson county Kentucky they did not stay too long back in Kentucky my grandmother got home sick so back to the farm of the Mr Faden - at Princeton Indiana there the second son was born on March 4 1883 Jerr.C. Hazelp your great grandfather after this son back to Kentucky and there they stayed and then the year - they had 11 children the sixth one lived to about two & three year and never walked he was call Little John after his daddy the children were Albert - Fisa - Radie - Eline - Roy - Little John - Rita - Ruby - Ronne - Mustl - Walter Hazelp It is told and said around 1910 John Henry Hazelp a mule riding breaker and was a breaker until my grandmother died in May 1933 Roy Hazelp enlisted in world war I in 1917 stayed in the states at Camp Grant and Rockford Ill. Ronne Hazelp left home in 1929 Home was three place - for the Hazelp's 1910 to 1935 Bowling Green Kentucky Sunside Kentucky and South Kentucky South is the one they call home it is said that John Henry Hazelp moved fifteen time in one year and about Twenty Five time - in his life time and never did get over 150 miles away.

Jess Hazelip my dad your great grandfather left his home in and around 1905 to work on the Illinois Central rail road in Kentucky in that time he meet and married your grandmother great grandmother to your David Bevrie Pearl Ford after a few year and a few children they left Kentucky and came to Appleton Illinois to a farm after one year on the farm your great grandfather when went back to the rail road this time Santa Fe rail Chillicothe Illinois by that time in there like - there was Nina - Damon - Millard - Fletcher the year 1922 and back to Kentucky we came here they stayed until after the rest of the children were born Jessie John Louise and Jess Hazelip Jr in and around the state of Kentucky May 29 1933 your great great grandmother died and was taking to Brownsville Kentucky and laid to rest in 1937 there was a flood a very big flood it flooded over half the city the city of Louisville Kentucky that August after the flood your great great grandfather gave up and we taking him and laid him beside your great great grandmother

In 1936 your great great grandfather move back to Illinois this time to Seneca Illinois instead of rail road this time it was highway work on 12 miles of hard road south of Seneca Ill this was he job for about two year in that time he came back to Kentucky to bury his father your great great grandfather there were a few gypsy year - that look like the wandering people of your great great grandfather time the moving around lasted until the begin of world war 2 two then it was back to Seneca Ill until 1946 then back to Kentucky and Indians where your great grandfather went in to pop corn and hauling ice this he was with until his death March 1947 he was the first Hazelip buried at the camp grounds at Sheperville Kentucky your great great grandmother follow 1955 to be by his side at the camp grounds - we should back up at this time to tell you your grand mother is also there December 1954 when your grand mother left us this caused my mind to go back in time come on David take my hand your grand Father Damon Hazelip as we trip back to 1930

1930 the begin of the depression year ~ and i was only 20 year - old
and had a good home but there was nothing no work to be had
but at that age you don't want work and there was hardly enough
to eat at home telling my self i could help them at home if
i left home with a boy or man my own age that told himself
the same thing.

His name was albert Bolton so Damon Hazelip and Albert
Bolton was on there way but we did not know where
about three month later we were in Brownsville Texas and still
we had found nothing a hand out here and one time the
depression was getting worse even the jail ~ did not want
you there were thousand by the thousand with nothing to
do eat but there was the hand of the master and by now he
had moved us all the way across Texas to Amarillo
Texas and put us in a church that had not up a place
to feed what they could it was a must that we hear what
the Lord had to say about the thousand ~ of us that was running
wild when we should be with our own and to gather our
Lamb ~ together that he could feed us there as well as he could
in Amarillo Texas when he came ^{to} a part that your great
grand mother had taught me as a child and as a child she
was always ~ after us kids to be in Sunday school
then the ward ~ came back give us this day our daily bread
then ~ knew that we did ^{not} have to beg for the bread when the
Lord would give to me

It was now the fall of the year of 1930 and i wanted to get
home the earliest home that he had for me bear and i wanted
to get there before winter so across Texas we started back
toward ~ Kentucky we made it sometime in November by this
time albert Bolton had be together six or eight month and
were pretty close so before going to great grand mother ~
we went to his home at 19 and Portland ave Louisville Ky. It was
there that i met your grand mother at that moment i thank
God and your great grand mother for force us me to come back
home i did go to my mother home that night and i did feel like
the last run on our return

1932 in the mean time i had been dating your grand mother and found that she had a little girl that has been a great part of all our life even now we will come back to her in a few years - that year 1932 same was a great year in mid summer your grand mother and I got married also i got two jobs one in a pickle factory and one tobacco factory i held up until 1933 the year your father was born we lived at 1509 West Jefferson St Louisville Kentucky i was at work when your Daddy was born he was born the 3rd month the 3rd day at 3 min after 3 the year 1933 at the City Hospital here in Louisville Ky he had been here about an hour when i saw him i saw him before i could see your Grand mother about 10 days latter we brought your father and our son to new home at 1821 W. Jefferson at 3 block down the street from 1509 W Jefferson St I had a new job then i was working at a Copper shop and we were doing very well i lost the job and job were hard to come by in those days by this time we were in the year 1934 and i got last again the story goes i went after a loaf of bread and was gone six month but again the Lord found me and brought me home this time i found your daddy my son with his grand mother your great grandmother your grand mother was working and staying with her dad and brother in 1936 your great grandfather's great grand mother took your daddy and moved to Seneca Ill a poor hard father was in at that time what they call the C.P.C. - had no job for six month.

your grand mother and i had got things in early part of 1936 . was ^{by} Fort Wayne Indiana she was in Louisville Ky together we going to meet at your great grand mother the summer of 1936 i got a Seneca first got a job in August 1936 your dad & great aunt Ruby, aaron and uncle Elmer Dunn brought your grand mother to the home at your great grand mother Bessie Pearl Hazelys that winter 1936 we moved to what we all call the big house on the creek.
