AN ACT to amend section forty-seven hundred and forty-six of the Revised Statutes of the United States. (30 Stat. L., 718.)

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That section forty-seven hundred and forty-six of the Revised Statutes of the United States is hereby amended to read as follows:

"That every person who knowingly or willfully makes or aids, or assists in the making, or in any wise procures the making or presentation of any false or fraudulent affidavit, declaration, certificate, voucher, or paper or writing purporting to be such, concerning any claim for pension or payment thereof, or pertaining to any other matter within the jurisdiction of the Commissioner of Pensions or of the Secretary of the Interior, or who knowingly or willfully makes or causes to be made, or aids or assists in the making, or presents or causes to be presented at any pension agency any power of attorney or other paper required as a voucher in drawing a pension, which paper bears a date subsequent to that upon which it was actually signed or acknowledged by the pensioner, and every person before whom any declaration, affidavit, voucher, or other paper or writing to be used in aid of the prosecution of any claim for pension or bounty land or payment thereof purports to have been executed who shall knowingly certify that the declarant, affiant, or witness named in such declaration, affidavit, voucher, or other paper or writing personally appeared before him and was sworn thereto, or acknowledged the execution thereof, when, in fact, such declarant, affiant, or witness did not personally appear before him or was not sworn thereto, or did not acknowledge the execution thereof, shall be punished by a fine not exceeding five hundred dollars, or by imprisonment for a term of not more than five years."

Approved July 7, 1895.

AN ACT to provide for the payment of accrued pensions in certain cases. (28 Stat. L., 964.)

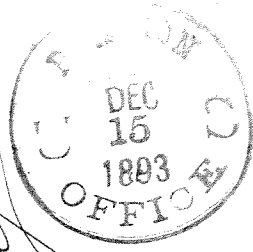
Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That from and after the twenty-eighth day of September, eighteen hundred and ninety-two, the accrued pension to the date of the death of any pensioner, or of any person entitled to a pension having an application therefor pending, and whether a certificate therefor shall issue prior or subsequent to the death of such person, shall, in the case of a person pensioned, or applying for pension, on account of his disabilities or service, be paid, first, to his widow; second, if there is no widow, to his child or children under the age of sixteen years at his death; third, in a case of a widow, to her minor children under the age of sixteen years at her death. Such accrued pension shall not be considered a part of the assets of the estate of such deceased person, nor be liable for the payment of the debts of said estate in any case whatsoever, but shall inure to the sole and exclusive benefit of the widow or children. And if no widow or child survive such pensioner, and in the case of his last surviving child who was such minor at his death, and in case of a dependent mother, father, sister, or brother, no payment whatsoever of their accrued pension shall be made or allowed except so much as may be necessary to reimburse the person who bore the expense of their last sickness and burial, if they did not leave sufficient assets to meet such expense. And the mailing of a pension check, drawn by a pension agent in payment of a pension due, to the address of a pensioner, shall constitute payment in the event of the death of a pensioner subsequent to the execution of the voucher therefor. And all prior laws relating to the payment of accrued pension are hereby repealed.

Approved March 2, 1895.

The act making appropriations for the payment of invalid and other pensions of the United States for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1910, and for other purposes, approved March 4, 1909, contains the following:

"And provided further, That hereafter the settlement of all claims for the reimbursement of expenses of the last sickness and burial of deceased pensioners shall be under the direction of the Commissioner of Pensions."

I have the honor to return herewith papers in of No 383,799 Isabel Sanders as widow of Abram J. Sanders late of Co A "60th Ill Vol Inf. whose address is No 822 Third Ave. Evansville Vanderburgh Co Ind together with Brig No. 609,386 on behalf of minor children of said soldier.

This case was referred for investigation to determine whether the widows had title to pension and if so whether same had been forfeited for violation of Act Aug 7/1882.

The widow claimant was served with usual notice and fully advised of her rights and privileges in the premises; she waived attendance at taking of testimony elsewhere than Evansville where deeming to circumstances of case none was taken. Following the above suggested report of Special Examiner Lowe and apparently unnoticed by Special Examiner Hall a prior marriage on part of soldier has been developed; no divorce has been found and the legal widows located.

Summary
Page 3

The claim of Isabel Saunders must fall with it the minors claim on the ground that soldiers marriage to said Isabel was illegal and void. It might be asked to prove a knowledge on part of the claimant which would incriminate her but under the circumstances it is doubtful whether a prosecution could be successfully maintained.

The soldiers sister Jamie Thompson who testified to some prior marriage 3/15 certainly perjured herself but the act is now outlawed.

The legal widow Amanda B. Saunders has borne a bad reputation for virtue but in my opinion it cannot be affirmatively shown that she has violated Act Aug 7 1882 since soldiers death. If she files again the matter should be referred into more particularly. This case is submitted

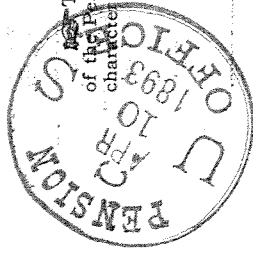

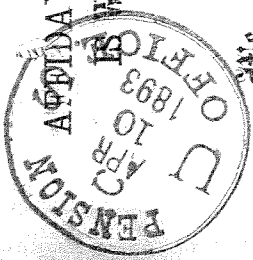
